Post-doctoral Fellow

Position Description:

CAMH's Institute for Mental Health Policy Research (IMHPR) is seeking a post-doctoral fellow to work in the area of LGBTQ2S health and homelessness, with a particular emphasis on understanding the health outcomes and key determinants of health for transgender individuals. The successful candidate will report to an independent scientist and be expected to contribute to a multidisciplinary team, liaise with Community Health Centres and agencies, support the execution of all aspects of a research study focused on investigating the health care utilization trajectories among transgender individuals in Ontario, conduct data analysis, and prepare manuscripts for publication in peer-reviewed journals. The successful candidate must be able to work independently and support a workplace that embraces diversity, encourages teamwork and complies with all applicable and regulatory requirements. This position is located at 33 Russell Street, Toronto, Ontario.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate will possess a Ph.D. in public health, psychology, epidemiology, or a related field. The successful candidate will have a strong background in population health, mental health, LGBTQ2S health, and social determinants of health.

Experience working with LGBTQ2S communities and strong familiarity with LGBTQ2S terminology is required.

The candidate will have demonstrated experience in all stages of research, including research project management; mixed methods; working with large datasets, such as survey and/or administrative health care data; data analysis (qualitative and quantitative); report writing; and experience and/or success in applying for funding.

Additional requirements include excellent organizational skills, commitment to high quality work and attention to detail, problem solving skills and excellent communication skills (written, oral and presentation). Bilingualism (French/English) and/or proficiency in a second language would be an asset.

This post-doctoral fellowship is for one year and carries a competitive stipend. Those who wish to apply should submit a cover letter outlining their research interests, a curriculum vitae, and 2-3 writing samples. Only successful candidates will be contacted for an interview.
