CSSHE 2020 graduate student travel grants

About the grants

<u>CSSHE</u> is pleased to announce travel grants to support graduate student participation at Congress 2020. These new awards are funded by the Congress Graduate Merit Awards, a new scheme funded by SSHRC through the Federation of Social Sciences and Humanities, and match funded by CSSHE. Up to six travel grants are available for graduate students who have been accepted to present a paper and who commit to actively participating throughout the CSSHE conference.

In keeping with the <u>theme of Congress 2020</u>, priority in offering the grants will be given to graduate students who identify as Canadian Indigenous or as Racialized (people who have been treated differently on the basis of background, colour or ethnicity). Priority will also be given to those presenting at their first CSSHE conference.

The grants are worth \$250 or \$500, variable depending on location. \$500 grants will be awarded to those travelling from out of Ontario or from hard to reach areas in Ontario; \$250 grants are for those travelling within Ontario. The grant will be provided as a reimbursement of costs after the conference.

Selection criteria

- Registered as a full-time or part-time graduate student (Master's or doctoral level) at a university or college in Canada during the entire 2019/20 academic year;
- Proposal to present at CSSHE has been accepted the proposal may be single authored or coauthored;
- Priority will be given to those who identify as Canadian Indigenous or as Racialized (people who have been treated differently on the basis of background, colour or ethnicity).
- Priority will be given to those presenting at their first CSSHE conference.
