Position Summary : The [Faculty of Education](#) at [Wilfrid Laurier University](#) invites applications for a 2-year Limited Term Appointment faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor in Education beginning July 1, 2020, subject to budgetary approval.

The position is open to candidates who hold a Doctorate (completed or to be completed no later than July 1, 2020) in Education or a closely related field. Successful candidates will show evidence of effective teaching in a post-secondary context including teaching diverse groups of learners and incorporating equity and inclusion into their pedagogy and practices. Candidates must provide evidence of a productive research program in teaching and international education. Eligibility for [graduate faculty status](#) is required.

Preference will be given to candidates who have at least three years' experience as an elementary and/or secondary school teacher. Preference will also be given to candidates who have teaching qualifications, with preference given to candidates holding Ontario College of Teachers certification. Preference will be given to candidates who show evidence of engagement or leadership in national or international educational communities.

Successful candidates should be able to teach core and/or elective courses in the Bachelor of Arts in International Education Studies, Bachelor of Education, Master of Education, and/or in the Education Minor programs. Courses to be taught will be a combination of introductory and more advanced levels primarily in International Education Studies.

The duties and responsibilities of the position are as follows:

- Teach core courses in the Bachelor of Arts in International Education Studies
- Teach courses in other programs in the Faculty of Education;
- Engage in an active research program related to international education studies;
- Engage in active service to the Faculty and the University

The Faculty of Education is rooted in a Teacher Education program, which is based on a Professional Development School model.
