QUEER BARRIERS:

SAFER SEX TECHNOLOGIES AND THE POLITICS OF RISK



Chris Barcelos, University of Wisconsin Madison

This talk combines archival and interview-based research with the lens of feminist science studies to interrogate the politics of queer safer sex technologies.

Focusing on the use of gloves and dental dams, I argue that rather than merely preventing the transmission of microbes, these technologies mobilize a particular set of politics surrounding risk and identity. In addition to claiming a space for the legitimacy of queer sex and nonnormative bodies, gloves and dams constitute a queer community ethics of care. Nevertheless, their use reifies the containment of queer bodies and the governmentality of safer sex promotion.
